Large print bibles have been gifted to us by Hilary and are now available in the Chapel. Our grateful thanks to her.




We welcome three new members of Staff

Book Recommendation by Lord Hylton - "Silent Earth"

This is essential reading for all concerned about the future of our planet and, indeed, our ability to sustain civilization as we know it.

Imagine a world without sufficient electricity, clean water or banking services. Can we avoid collapses such as the Roman and Islamic civilizations suffered?

The title recalls Rachel Carson's famous "Silent Spring", about the use and abuse of the chemical known as DDT. The author has a life-time's experience of the importance of insects, not just as pollinators, but in the ecology of birds, fishes and people. He stresses the importance of bees, not only honey-bees, together with wild bees, wasps, flies, beetles and worms. He was understandably concerned by the sharp decline in insect numbers in developed countries and in tropical regions, over the last 50 years.

Part three deals with the various causes of the population decline, at a time when the number of humans has risen dramatically.


Part four describes the warnings given in 1992, and again in 2017, by thousands of scientists, about the probable consequences of global pollution and climate change. These have also been largely disregarded, so this section looks back on the possible conditions for human life, after civilization has unravelled.

Part five is highly constructive and hopeful. It explains how awareness can be raised and how groups and individuals can help to avoid disaster. We cannot afford to bury our heads in the sand, like ostriches when danger approaches.
