An Update from Debbie

As our guests have returned to Ammerdown or discovered us for the first time, we have received some very positive comments about our refurbished bedrooms. Our team has continued to work on the second stage of the redecorating development. By the end of August, we hope to have all the bedrooms in the centre freshly painted, carpeted and equipped with new beds to facilitate a better experience for our guests. We will also be adding two new electronic mobility beds to two of our rooms. The next project will be to refresh Aldrich cottage which welcomes guests throughout the year for a break away from everyday life, offering a peaceful place nestled here in the countryside.

We are very grateful to the Sperring Trust – who gave us a grant to buy a defibrillator. The defibrillator is located on the outside



of our building to the left of

reception. This will benefit not only our guests but the wider community, potentially helping to save lives. The Sperring Trust is a charity which supports organisations in the local area and provides financial support from the legacy of local resident, Ralph Sperring.



With summer here and the long summer evenings, we look forward to hosting two outdoor theatre shows in the Ammerdown garden. They are 'The Tale of Peter Rabbit and Benjamin Bunny' and Shakespeare's 'The Tempest'. These are performed by

I have been on duty at reception, welcoming those who arrive, some of whom have been longing to return after a long time away. Climate Change and Worldwide Migration

On 8 June I joined an Ammerdown Zoom. The G7 were meeting in Cornwall, and the aim was to raise awareness of the issues in preparation for the meeting of Governments and advisers in Glasgow in November, called COP 26. Participants joined in from all over Britain.

Tess Humble from Edinburgh was our lead speaker. She had previously been the Director of

the Borderlands Project in Bristol, helping refugees and inner city residents. She touched our consciences by reminding us that a 'hostile environment' for refugees and migrants had recently been official British policy. We now live in a common 'Gaia', symbol of one shared Green Earth. Indigenous people are often the best guardians of this. Long despised or ignored, they have generations of experience in how to conserve our planet.

In 2019 major displacements of people took place in India, Bangladesh, Iran and Africa. Too many face the bitter choice of staying put or migrating. Most moves are from country to city. Many, however, have to cross borders. We have seen the drying of sub-Saharan Africa, forcing people to risk their lives to reach the Canary Islands, Spain, Malta, Italy etc. At the same time the United States and the European Union have been trying to close their borders. Newcomers may be suspect or unwelcome; nevertheless each year they send back to poor countries three times as much money as these countries receive in aid (from all sources).

Walls and Detention Centres are not the answer. Regional solutions will have to be found, in such a way that the whole burden of climate migration and flight from war, does not fall on the poorest people, least able to bear it.
